Position	Educational Psychologist 0.8 FTE Temporary (Two days at each school)

We are seeking a dynamic and enthusiastic Educational Psychologist to work with both St Mary's School and St Joseph's School in 2017. The role encompasses working two full days at each school. To be successful in this role, you will bring experience of delivering a comprehensive psychology service to both schools, including psychological assessments, funding applications, complex case management, counselling, advocacy and support for students and families, and critical incident response.

You will have experience of working within a multidisciplinary team, with a clear focus on early intervention and capacity building through designing and delivering professional learning for school staff. Your ability to establish and maintain productive and consultative relationships will be critical as will the ability to deliver outcomes and drive change.

This is a temporary position commencing February 2017 to 31 December 2017 with the possibility of a contract extension beyond 2017.

St Joseph's is a single stream co-educational school with 237 students from Pre-Kindergarten – Year 6. St Mary's is a double stream co-educational school with 460 students from Kindergarten – Year 6. The schools are located in modern premises in Kalgoorlie-Boulder and are adjacent to the Parish Church. Both schools enjoy a close relationship with the Parish and strong support from the parent community.

Kalgoorlie-Boulder, with a population of about 35,000, offers an attractive lifestyle providing restaurants, take-aways, cafes, a cinema complex and shopping comparable with other major centres. It is just a one hour flight from Perth.

Selection Criteria:

Applications are invited from enthusiastic and innovative educators with the following attributes:

- Administering tests and using other assessment tools to determine appropriate strategies for intervention with students;
- Providing counselling to members of the school community on issues pertaining to their psychological and emotional wellbeing;
- Working collaboratively with other members of the Learning Support team to deliver positive outcomes for students at risk;
- Providing referrals to outside agencies as appropriate;
- Assisting in the preparation and delivery of appropriate programs and presentations to staff, students and parents;
- Keeping accurate records of interviews and writing detailed reports as necessary;
- Case management;
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team;
- Ability to maintain a high level of integrity;

- Demonstrated ability in assessment and strategy development for students with disabilities and learning difficulties;
- Sound organisational skills;
- High standard of effective verbal and written communication skills;
- The ability to work within strict Privacy Act Guidelines.

Desirable expertise and experience:

- An appropriate teaching degree;
- Be fully registered with the Psychology Board of Australia.

Qualification/s Required:

- Relevant minimum four year tertiary qualification in Psychology;
- Be eligible for registration with the Psychology Board of Australia

Applicants must be fully supportive of the objectives and ethos of Catholic education.

Applicants must submit curriculum vitae, addressed to the Principal, including the names and contact numbers of three referees, one of whom must be the current employer. A current Federal Police Clearance/100 Point Identification Check must also be included. The appropriate Criminal History Record Check form is available from the Department of Education and Training website (www.det.wa.edu.au). In the case of teachers, a current Teachers Registration Board of West Australian (TRBWA) registration number shall be provided in lieu, as ongoing registration requires a current Police Clearance.

On appointment successful applicants will require a Working With Children Check. Application forms are available at certain Australia Post outlets throughout the state.
